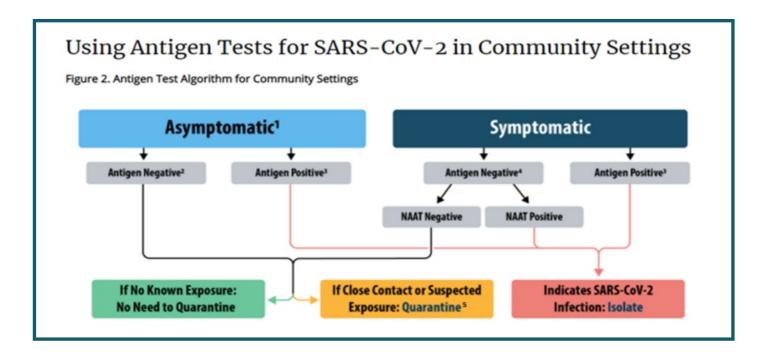

COVID-19 Testing Update

STC is now testing in-house and no longer offering SEARHC PCR tests.

We offer Antigen and NAAT (Molecular) tests. Results are generally ready within 15 to 30 minutes. Currently, we are seeing increasing amount of COVID cases in town.

Please stay home if feeling ill. Please reference the following flow chart if you used at home tests.



Testing is done every Tuesday & Thursday from 2-4 pm with no appointment necessary. Please use the QR code to register your information prior to testing.

*Proof of a negative test will no longer be required for Canada entry starting April 1st, 2022. Please confirm with the Canadian Boarder prior to heading up to Canada.



Order FREE at-home antigen tests

Every home in the U.S. is eligible to order up to 4 kits (2 tests each) of free at-home antigen tests. To order antigen tests please visit www.covidtests.gov

Essential Oil Safety Blending Class-

In March, STC held an Essential Oil Safety Blending Class hosted by local business owner Annemarie Hasskamp. She taught how to properly mix and store essential oils, what oils to avoid having on your skin, oils that can help with ailments and scents that repel pests.

Try this *Summer Blend* Mix 1part lemon, eucalyptus or lavender oil with 10 parts Witch Hazel. Helps to keep those bugs away!

Recipe for Cranberry Nut Bread

Ingredients:

- ♦ 2 cups flour
- 1 cup sugar
- ◆ 11/2 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- ♦ 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 cup butter
- ♦ 3/4 cup orange juice
- 1 Tbsp. grated orange rind
- 1 egg, well beaten
- ◆ 1/2 cup chopped walnut
- ◆ 11/2 cup wild cranberries

Instructions:

Mix together first five ingredients, cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse corn meal. Combine orange juice and rind with egg and pour into dry mixture. Mix just until damp, fold in nuts and berries. Spoon into sprayed pan. Bake one hour at 350 F, or until bread springs back when lightly touched. Let set for five to ten minutes. Remove from pan to cool.
