

Tribal Council Resolution 2022-12

Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation

BEACH Grant

- WHEREAS, the Skagway Traditional Council (STC) is the governing body of the Skagway Village, a federally recognized Tribe; and
- **WHEREAS,** surveys conducted from 2015 2022 have consistently identified water quality concerns as high-priority issues for Tribal Citizens; and
- **WHEREAS,** excessive levels of bacteria present in waterbodies can cause serious health effects in recreational users; and
- **WHEREAS,** STC conducts ongoing water quality monitoring projects but does not currently monitor pathogens in local waters; and
- WHEREAS, Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) has announced the availability of funds for recreational beach pathogen monitoring through the Alaska Clean Water Actions (ACWA) grant program; and
- WHEREAS, investigating marine pathogens in the waters of recreational beaches will require funding for equipment, labor, training, and contract fees beyond what is available from current funding sources; and
- **WHEREAS,** the DEC ACWA grant program allows Tribes to apply for funds covering these costs; and
- **WHEREAS**, STC staff would like to apply for the DEC ACWA grant.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Skagway Traditional Council does hereby authorize STC staff to apply for the DEC Alaska Clean Water Actions grant.
